RESIDENTIAL CAMPS

THEATRE CAMP

June 10–15 • Ages: entering grades 4–10

Develop performing arts skills in acting, voice, movement and stage combat with the Magical Theatre Company. Campers will learn and perform scenes from classic plays and films that utilize the outdoors as a stage. It's a week of fun, fantasy and drama in the forests and fields of the national park.

Fee: \$425 overnight, \$325 day only*

FARM CAMP

July 8–13 • Ages: entering grades 4–8

Farm it, Sell it, Cook it! Spend a week cultivating your food from farm to fork. You will experience farm life in the Cuyahoga Valley, then and now. Each morning begins with farm chores to include feeding pigs, sheep and chickens, watering crops, picking veggies and helping to prepare fresh, healthy meals. You will be digging in the dirt, planting seedlings, harvesting crops, learning new kitchen skills and crafting fresh eats.

SURVIVOR CAMP

July 15–20 • Ages: entering grades 5–10

Test your survivor skills! Build a fire...without matches. Solve complex puzzles...before time runs out. Learn to hide...in plain sight. Through daily adventures, campers will sharpen their skills necessary to take on the ultimate task: spending a night underneath the stars in Cuyahoga Valley National Park. Will you accept the 'Survivor' challenge?

Fee: \$425

CHEF CAMP

July 22–27 • Ages: entering grades 7–11

Learn to cook using fresh, local foods! Area chefs will coach you on how to turn local farm products into delicious dishes. Design the menu and create one bite dishes to be served on the last day at your own pop-up restaurant. Go shopping for the ingredients at a local Farmers' Market and along the way, visit the farms and farmers that grew your food. Tasting sessions and theme dinners add flavor to this recipe for a week of healthy food-filled fun.

JUNIOR RANGER DAY CAMP

July 16–20 & July 23–27 • Ages: 6–11, Times: 9 a.m.–3 p.m.

At Junior Ranger Day Camp, in Cuyahoga Valley National Park, every day is a new and exciting adventure. This unique program gives campers the opportunity to explore, interact with rangers, discover exciting organisms, make new friends, and become Junior Rangers of Cuyahoga Valley National Park. Campers will spend their days outside exploring the forests, streams, meadows, and trails surrounding our home base at Happy Days Lodge. At the end of the week, the campers will have completed the requirements to become Junior Rangers and will receive their badges in a ceremony for friends and family. The badge ceremony will take place Friday at 3 p.m.

Day Camp will take place at Happy Days Lodge. The facility is located on State Route 303, 2 miles east of the Village of Peninsula and 1 mile west of State Route 8.
