850 National Park Trail Supporters Visit CVNP for Weekend of Trail Fundraising

Peninsula, Ohio – Last weekend, over 850 people visited Ohio's national park to attend two fundraising events for the Conservancy for Cuyahoga Valley National Park (CVNP), raising \$110,000 for the park's trails.

The events, Elevation and Topography, were part of a weekend-long celebration in support of TRAILS FOREVER, a partnership of the National Park Service and the Conservancy dedicated to preserving, maintaining, and enhancing the national park's trail system.

The festivities began on Friday night with Elevation, where over 400 guests spent the evening hiking, dining, and dancing to live music from Acid Cats and Abby Normal & the Detroit Lean. A spectacular sunset capped off the evening as guests danced under the Ledges Shelter.

The following night, 450 guests gathered at the Ledges Overlook for Topography, a truly gorgeous evening of gourmet dining, camaraderie, and campfires under the stars. Thirty-four Topography guests contributed an additional donation to stay overnight in private tents, waking up to a gourmet breakfast and ranger-led hike the next morning.

All proceeds from the events were allocated to the TRAILS FOREVER Legacy Fund, an endowment fund held at both the Cleveland Foundation and Akron Community Foundation and dedicated solely to CVNP trail operation and maintenance.
